#### INTRODUCTION

NLW MSS 22440-89 were purchased from Dylan's Bookstore, Swansea, in three groups, in January and August 1983 and in April 1986 (see *Annual Report, 1982-83*, p. 47; 1983-84, p. 52; 1985-86, p. 60). Since, to all intents and purposes, the three groups formed part of a single archive they have been treated as such. These papers complement the groups of Vernon Watkins manuscripts previously acquired by the National Library: NLW MS 20787E, acquired through the Welsh Arts Council in 1971 (see *Annual Report, 1970-71*, p. 74) and NLW MSS 21263-6E, purchased from Mrs Gwen Watkins in 1974 (see *Annual Report, 1974-75*, p. 47). Those manuscripts were fully described in the typescript *List of Vernon Watkins MSS*. A small group of drafts, now Minor Deposit 722B, was deposited by Vernon Watkins himself in 1961 (see *Annual Report, 1961-62*, p. 57).

A schedule of NLW MSS 22440-89 had already been completed when a further group of Vernon Watkins's correspondence, manuscripts and papers, now NLW MSS 22552-3E, was purchased in July 1988 from Dylan's Bookstore, Swansea. Letters in this group from correspondents already represented in the first series have been incorporated into NLW MSS 22485-8, but otherwise the 1988 purchase has been described separately in an appendix [together with five further purchases, 1989-1998].

Other major groups of Vernon Watkins manuscripts, complementary to those at NLW, are British Library Add. MSS 54157-67 (see Jenny Stratford, *The Arts Council Collection of Modern Literary Manuscripts*, 1963-1972 (London, 1974) [Stratford], pp. 63-66, and R. E. Oldroyd, *An Index of the Worksheets of the Poems of Vernon Watkins presented to the National Manuscripts Collection of Contemporary Poets* (University of Hull, 1966) [Oldroyd]).

Before being acquired by the National Library NLW MSS 22440-89, 22552-3E had undergone preliminary sorting by Dr Ruth Pryor and Mrs Gwen Watkins. The disorder of the poet's papers at his death and the difficulties of sorting have been vividly described by Dr Ruth Pryor in 'The Palethorpe Papers, or, A Bibliographer's Nightmare', *Poetry Wales*, 12.4 (1977), 44-51.

Drafts of individual poems or works have now been arranged chronologically as far as possible, and all unbound papers guarded and filed at NLW.

Miscellaneous papers belonging to Vernon Watkins and included in the three groups purchased 1983-6 are now NLW ex 1003. Books formerly in the poet's possession, including gifts from other authors, have been transferred to the Department of Printed Books.
