- ff. 1-108 An abridgement of *Le Livre des assises* (see the 1679 edition of the Year Books) arranged under thirty-two non-alphabetical headings (listed on f. x<sup>v</sup>) beginning *Causes de disseisin de rent et de terre* (ff. 1-2), *Pleintz en assise* (ff. 2<sup>v</sup>-5<sup>v</sup>), *Proces en assise* (ff. 6-8). The underlying text appears to have been based on reports for cases for 20-44 Edward III, although a few cases for the years 16-19 Edward III are incorporated, and also for 2 Edward II (ff. 44 and 74, both accompanied by references to *Liber Asaph*) and 11 Henry IV (f. 36<sup>v</sup>). There are additions and annotation by hand A, and by some other hands, including references to 49 Edward III (f. 21) and 'tempore regis Henrici V<sup>ti</sup>' (f. 108<sup>v</sup>). Besides the regular references to years of reports there are frequent citations of '1<sup>0</sup> liber', with folio references.
